## Soap Making Workshop

Barbara Benton from Little Cabin Crafts, LLC in Auburn demonstrates making handcrafted soaps in a workshop at Massabesic Audubon Center in Auburn.

Learn how to make soap on Saturday, January 28, 2012, from 1 – 3 PM at the Massabesic Audubon Center. A local soap maker from Auburn, Barbara Benton, will demonstrate making handcrafted soap by the cold process method using all natural ingredients and essential oils. Follow the entire process: the selection of a recipe and ingredients, the choice of utensils and equipment, mixing and pouring into a mold. Finally, watch a recently processed batch being cut into bars using a guitar string. Take home a finished soap bar from a previously cured batch. Ms. Benton will discuss other methods of soap making and will pass on tips and techniques that she has learned as she refined her soap making process. Ms. Benton began making soap over five years ago, first as gifts for friends and then for sale, through her home-based business, Little Cabin Crafts. Ms. Benton's soap is available locally at the Massabesic Audubon Center in Auburn, McLane Audubon Center in Concord and Consign at Second Avenue in Amherst. Workshop cost is \$15 for New Hampshire Audubon members and \$25 for non-members plus an additional materials fee of \$5. Call 668-2045 to pre-register. Oatmeal Scrubbie uses ground oatmeal to act as a hand cleaner and gentle exfoliant. Ms. Benton became interested in soap making after enjoying soaps made by a relative. "As I made batches to use as gifts, people started calling and asking how could they get more? Pretty soon, I needed the company to help me keep up with demand." Ms. Benton grew up in West Virginia surrounded by crafters, including her mother, a quilter and artist whose oil painting inspired the company's logo.
